2 Digest

1. What does this passage show me about God?

The fig leaves were their idea; whose idea are the garments of skin, and who does the clothing?

2. What does it show me about people — and about myself?

What have you been using as fig leaves — achievements, appearances, silence — to cover your shame?

3. What will I obey this week? (a concrete step, with a day)

What self-made covering will you set down this week to let God cover you instead?

4. Who will I tell?

Who is exhausted from covering themselves, to whom you could tell this story of the God who clothes?

3 Grow

Growth is God's part, not yours. Do the cycle faithfully and trust Him to give the growth (1 Corinthians 3:6–7).

✦ Pray

God, my own coverings are as thin as fig leaves. Thank you that you yourself made garments and clothed the very people who had dishonored you — clothe me like that.



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
