1. What does this passage show me about God?

Trace what God does step by step for the abandoned girl — from 'Live!' to washing, covering, adorning, and making her a queen; whose splendor makes her beautiful?

2. What does it show me about people — and about myself?

Which part of this picture is hardest for you to believe God would do for you?

3. What will I obey this week? (a concrete step, with a day)

How will you live this week out of the splendor God has given rather than the rejection you started with?

4. Who will I tell?

Who feels thrown away — by family, by community — and needs to hear about the God who stops for abandoned ones?

3 Grow

Growth is God's part, not yours. Do the cycle faithfully and trust Him to give the growth (1 Corinthians 3:6–7).

★ Pray

God, you found me like that abandoned child — unwanted, uncovered, left in the open field — and you said 'Live.' Thank you that my beauty before you is the splendor you yourself placed on me.
