2. What does it show me about people — and about myself?

3. What will I obey this week? (a concrete step, with a day)

The criminal simply asked — what honest words will you say to Jesus this week?

4. Who will I tell?

Who is facing death or grief who needs to hear this promise?

3 Grow

Jesus, a dying criminal with nothing left to offer asked you to remember him, and you promised him paradise that very day. Remember me too.



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
