1. What does this passage show me about God?

2. What does it show me about people — and about myself?

The apostles rejoiced at being counted worthy to suffer disgrace for the Name. How does that compare with how you respond when following Jesus costs you something?

3. What will I obey this week? (a concrete step, with a day)

The Seven were chosen to serve so the word could keep spreading. What unglamorous act of service will you take on this week?

4. Who will I tell?

Even under threats, 'they never stopped teaching and proclaiming that Jesus is the Messiah.' Who on your daily path has still not heard that from you?

3 Grow

Growth is God's part, not yours. Do the cycle faithfully and trust Him to give the growth (1 Corinthians 3:6–7).

Pray

Father, you took the honesty of your church seriously with Ananias and Sapphira, and you solved its first conflict by appointing servants. Keep me honest before you, and make me willing to wait on tables.
