2 Digest

Answer from what the passage actually says — stay in the text.

1. What does this passage show me about God?

What different opinions do people hold about Jesus throughout this chapter, and what does Jesus promise to anyone who is thirsty (vv. 37–39)?

2. What does it show me about people — and about myself?

The crowd was divided — prophet, Messiah, deceiver. Who do the people around you say Jesus is, and who do you say he is?

3. What will I obey this week? (a concrete step, with a day)

Jesus said that anyone who chooses to do God's will will find out whether his teaching comes from God (v. 17). What will you do this week to test his word by obeying it?

4. Who will I tell?

Rivers of living water are meant to flow out, not pool up. Toward whom will the water flow through you this week?

3 Grow

Growth is God's part, not yours. Do the cycle faithfully and trust Him to give the growth (1 Corinthians 3:6–7).

★ Pray

Jesus, at the feast you stood and cried out, 'Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink.' I am thirsty — fill me with your Spirit until rivers flow out to others.



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
