2 Digest

Answer from what the passage actually says — stay in the text.

1. What does this passage show me about God?

Follow the man born blind through this chapter. How does his understanding of who Jesus is grow with each interrogation?

2. What does it show me about people — and about myself?

The disciples asked who sinned; Jesus said this happened so that the works of God might be displayed. How does that change the way you look at suffering?

3. What will I obey this week? (a concrete step, with a day)

The man obeyed a strange instruction — 'Go, wash in the Pool of Siloam' — before he could see. What act of obedience is Jesus asking of you this week, even if you don't yet understand it?

4. Who will I tell?

'One thing I do know: I was blind but now I see.' What is the one thing you know Jesus has done for you — and who will you tell this week?

3 Grow

Growth is God's part, not yours. Do the cycle faithfully and trust Him to give the growth (1 Corinthians 3:6–7).

★ Pray

Jesus, the man could only say, 'I was blind but now I see' — and it was enough. Open my eyes, and give me his simple courage when others question my faith.



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
