1 Eat

2 Digest

Answer from what the passage actually says — stay in the text.

1. What does this passage show me about God?

What does Jesus promise about the Father's house, about himself as the way, and about the Holy Spirit in this chapter?

2. What does it show me about people — and about myself?

Jesus ties love and obedience together: 'If you love me, keep my commands.' What does that connection reveal about your love for him right now?

3. What will I obey this week? (a concrete step, with a day)

'Do not let your hearts be troubled... Trust in God; trust also in me.' What trouble will you deliberately hand over to him this week — and what will you do instead of worrying?

4. Who will I tell?

Jesus said, 'No one comes to the Father except through me.' Who needs to hear that there is a way — and how will you tell them gently this week?

3 Grow

Growth is God's part, not yours. Do the cycle faithfully and trust Him to give the growth (1 Corinthians 3:6–7).

Pray

Jesus, you are the way and the truth and the life, and you did not leave us as orphans — you sent the Helper. Calm my troubled heart, and teach me to love you by obeying you.



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
