3. What will I obey this week? (a concrete step, with a day)

Jairus had to keep believing between the message of death and the miracle. Where do you need to 'only believe' and keep walking this week?

4. Who will I tell?

The man told his story throughout the Ten Towns and 'all the people were amazed.' What has the Lord done for you, and who will you tell?

3 Grow

Growth is God's part, not yours. Do the cycle faithfully and trust Him to give the growth (1 Corinthians 3:6–7).
